About our school

St. George's Primary School is located on the beautiful Island of Portland, Dorset, along the Jurassic Coast, a World Heritage Site and joined to the mainland by Chesil Beach. We are embedded in the heart of the community and we ensure our school provides a friendly, inclusive and nurturing environment for our children.

We are a thriving and welcoming 2-form entry Primary School catering for children aged between 4 - 11 years. We are a popular school that is annually over-subscribed in Reception. There are presently 432 children on roll. The school is located on a large site that includes: an athletic's track; orienteering course; two fantastic football pitches; excellent wildlife and Forest School area; a heated open-air swimming pool; a MUGA sport's pitch and two separate playgrounds for Key Stage 1 and 2.

We were judged as 'good' by OFSTED in our last inspection in October 2021 - 'St. George's Primary School is a large school with the ethos and feel of a small school. The school's motto of 'Inspire, Believe, Achieve' sums up St. George's Primary. Pupils are inspired by interesting and captivating lessons. Staff believe in every pupil. Pupils achieve well, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).'



Curriculum and Enrichment

St. George's offers children a safe and happy environment where children can be inspired to take brave steps in their learning. Our relational and nurturing approach provides children with the self-belief and belief in others so that each individual can achieve success at an academic, social, spiritual and emotional level. Through our bespoke curriculum we aspire for our children to develop a lifelong love of learning and to build a secure knowledge that they will stay with them for their entire lives. We not only exceed the legal requirements of the National Curriculum (including the Foundation Stage) but provide a wide range of experiences and opportunities that enables our children to develop the life skills and confidence needed to be happy, successful and resilient when they venture out into the wider world.

St. George's Primary School has high aspirations for all children identified as having SEND in our school. We are committed to making sure all our pupils have the chance to thrive and support them to meet their full potential. We are focused on creating an inclusive environment, where provision is adapted to the needs and abilities of pupils, no matter how varied.

Partnership

St. George's Primary School works in partnership with six other local authority maintained primary schools, The Chesil Collaboration. The main foci of this collaboration is to aid and enhance school improvement, provide support and high quality continuous professional development and to share good practice across the primary schools.

We have also developed good relationships with other local organisations and groups: the Church, local charities, Portland Museum and work in partnership with our main feeder pre-schools and Atlantic Academy.

St. George's Primary School encourages parental/carer involvement and we work with parents to provide the information and guidance they need to support their child's health, wellbeing, happiness and overall educational needs. We have a fantastic Parent Teacher Association who run many special events for our pupils throughout the year.
